Low-income Energy Support Program offers discounts up to 40 percent

Many low-income customers may qualify to receive as much as a 40% discount on their cost of electricity with our E-3 Energy Support Program and an exemption from Power Supply Adjustor (PSA) charges. The PSA is an adjustment mechanism that collects the difference between what we are paying for fuel and purchased power. Eligibility for the E-3 program is based on the following income guidelines and the discount amount is based on how much electricity you use each month. So, if your energy use varies, your discount will vary from month to month.

Monthly Energy Use	400 kWh or less	401 kWh to 800 kWh	801 kWh to 1,200 kWh	Over 1,200 kWh
Discount	40 percent	26 percent	14 percent	\$13

To qualify for the discount, you must have an APS residential account in your name, and your household income must be within the guidelines shown below. The income guidelines are updated every July 1. To maintain eligibility, you must recertify for the program each year. Approximately 60 days prior to your anniversary date, DES will mail you a renewal application.

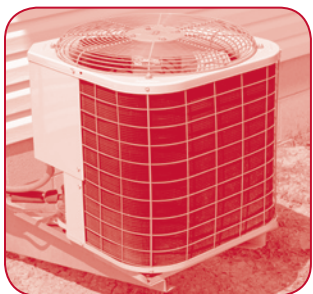

Save 4 ways with high efficiency A/C

You could save more than \$700 when you replace your air conditioning unit. APS customers who replace their aging, inefficient air conditioning (AC) units with new high efficiency units can save four ways:

- APS offers up to \$400 in rebates
 - \$250 per unit on equipment that meets or exceeds 14 SEER and 12 EER
 - \$400 per unit on equipment that meets or exceeds 16 SEER and 14 EER

- The federal government offers up to \$300 in tax credits
- A high-efficiency unit can save 40%–50% on cooling costs
- You'll help save the environment by using less energy

APS recommends that customers who are considering having their AC equipment replaced should contact a licensed AC contractor for more information about what AC units qualify for APS rebates and federal tax credits. Lighting can account for up to 7% of a home's annual electricity consumption — that's no small amount. Installing compact fluorescent lights (CFLs) is one of the easiest ways to start making an impact on your energy bills.

Modern compact fluorescent lights offer the following features and benefits:

- Bulbs use 75% less energy — saving you money
- Save an average of \$25 over the life of the bulb
- Last up to 10 times longer
- Operate at cooler temps — increasing indoor comfort
