

### Four Corners' five units hit 93.9 percent mark

September and October were excellent production months for the Four Corners Power Plant.

The coal-powered plant, with five units built between 1963 and 1970, had an overall capacity factor during those months of 93.9 percent. Overall in 2006, Four Corners had a capacity factor of 88.5 percent compared with the industry average of 72 percent.
