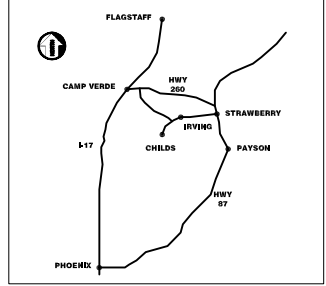
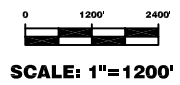


Site Location and Access
 The Childs Irving Project is an operating hydroelectric facility located on Fossil Creek in Central Arizona. It consists of two developments: Childs and Irving. The project is entirely on land of the United States, managed by the Forest Service and is part of the Coconino and Tonto National Forests.

Childs and Irving hydroelectric power plants are located approximately 110 miles north of Phoenix, Arizona. Environmentally sensitive areas surround each one. The only access to the facility is to use steep, narrow, winding, and primitive dirt roads. One of the roads is approximately 22 miles long and enters off of the State Highway 260, which is six miles east of Camp Verde. The other access road is approximately 15 miles long and the entrance is off of State Highway 87 at Strawberry, Arizona.
