20	FINDINGS OF FACT		
21	Background		
	1. On January 7, 2022, Arizona Pu	blic Service Company ("ADS" or "Company"	
22	, , , , , , , , , , , , , , , , , , ,		
23	submitted a request pursuant, to Arizona Revised Statutes ("A.R.S.") § 40-252, to amend Decisio		
24	No. 52428, issued by the Arizona Corporation Commission ("Commission") on September 3, 198		
25	("Application"). Decision No.52428 approved CEC 52, that authorized APS and San Diego Gas		
26	Electric ("SDG&E") to construct a 120-mile single circuit 500 kilovolt ("kV") transmission lin		

from the Palo Verde Generating Station Switchyard to North Gila 500 kV substation near Yuma,

Arizona and west to the Arizona-California border.

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- 2. McFarland Solar is developing a 500 megawatt ("MW") photovoltaic solar facility and a 435 MW Battery Energy Storage System ("Solar Project"), that will be constructed in two phases. The Solar Project is located south of the Hoodoo Wash-North Gila Line, near the Hoodoo Wash Switchyard. McFarland Solar has requested to interconnect the Solar Project to the Hoodoo Wash Switchyard.
- 3. APS has an obligation to provide interconnection services to McFarland Solar, pursuant to the APS Open Access Transmission Tariff. For this reason, the Company, through the present Application, requests that the Commission authorize APS to convert an existing single-circuit 500 kV line, to a double-circuit 500 kV line, to permit the interconnection of the new Solar Project into the Hoodoo Wash 500 kV Switchyard. The changes will require the construction of a new 500 kV generation tie line single-circuit, approximately half a mile long. This new Gen-Tie line, will be collocated with a portion of the existing Hoodoo Wash-North Gila line, creating a single span of double-circuit 500 kV lines. Two new tubular structures will replace the two existing lattice structures and will be placed in the existing right-of-way of the Hoodoo Wash-North Gila Line.
- 4. APS performed interconnection studies to analyze the reliability impacts of interconnecting the Solar Project at the Hoodoo Wash Switchyard. These studies established sufficient capacity to interconnect the Solar Project and showed no adverse impacts to the transmission system.
- 5. The Company believes, that considering that the proposed changes create no impacts to the environment or the reliability of the transmission system, there is no need for an evidentiary hearing, and this matter should be considered and approved by the Commission. APS also states that the construction would need to start by March 2022, to allow the work to coincide with the outage window schedules for the Hoodoo Wash-North Gila Line. Therefore, the Company requests that the Application be considered and decided during the Commission's February or March 2022 Open Meeting.

Staff Analysis and Recommendations

 Given the proposed collocation of the new Gen-Tie line and the replacement of existing lattice structure in the existing right-of-way of the Hoodoo Wash-North Gila Line, Staff 1

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concludes that it is not necessary to refer APS's request back to the Arizona Power Plant and Transmission Line Siting Committee for an additional evidentiary hearing. Therefore, Staff recommends the Commission approve APS's request, pursuant to A.R.S. § 40-252, to amend Decision No. 52428 to convert an approximately 0.5-mile segment of the single -circuit 500 kV Hoodoo Wash-North Gila Line to a double-circuit 500 kV line to permit the interconnection of a new photovoltaic solar plus storage project into the Hoodoo Wash 500kV Switchyard.

CONCLUSIONS OF LAW

- The Commission has jurisdiction over Arizona Public Service Company and the subject matter contained herein pursuant to Article XV of the Arizona Constitution and A.R.S. §§ 40-252 and 40-360 et seq.
 - 2. Notice of this proceeding has been given in the manner provided by law.
- 3. The Commission, having reviewed and considered the motion to amend Decision No. 52428 and the Staff Memorandum, concludes that it is in the public interest to amend the Certificate of Environmental Compatibility Case No. 52 authorizing the construction of a new single-circuit 500 kV Gen-Tie Line, collocated with a portion of the existing Hoodoo Wash-North Gila Line, creating a single span of double-circuit 500 kV lines, to permit the interconnection of a new photovoltaic solar plus storage project into the Hoodoo Wash 500 kV Switchyard.

ORDER

IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED that Decision No. 52428 is hereby amended to include the construction of a new single-circuit 500kV Gen-Tie Line, collocated with a portion of the existing Hoodoo Wash-North Gila Line from the Certificate of Environmental Compatibility Case No. 52 issued to Arizona Public Service Company. All conditions imposed on the project and Applicant in Decision No. 52428 hereby apply to the approved changes.
