


Managing Vegetation for Community Safety and Power Reliability



At APS, your safety is our number one priority. Ensuring power lines and electrical boxes are clear of vegetation and debris can reduce outages and help avoid safety risks. Here are guidelines for managing vegetation around your home.


Defensible space around poles

To keep everyone safe and increase power reliability, please avoid planting any vegetation within a 10-foot radius around electrical equipment.



Electrical boxes on your property

Make sure you do not block electrical boxes on your property. We need room to work safely and quickly to restore power if there is an outage. Do not place permanent structures, fences, shrubs, trees, sprinklers or irrigation systems within 10 feet of the door to the box, two feet from the sides of the box or six feet from the left-side corner of the pad.



Right tree, right place

We all benefit when trees are planted in the right place. Trees planted in the wrong place can be a safety hazard and cause power outages. Make sure you're planting the right tree in the right place on your property.
