

## Pick someone to remind you when your bill is due.

When you can't view your energy bill in a timely manner, it's nice to know someone you trust is there to help. You still manage your bill, and your Safety Net partner is not responsible for paying it. They're just there to remind you when your bill is due and to be notified if your account becomes past-due.

## Here's how it works:

- You designate your Safety Net partner
- Your partner receives a copy of your APS bills
- If needed, your partner reminds you when the bill is due or past-due
- Safety Net partners can set you up on payment arrangements
