**Subject: §257.102(f)(2)(i) 2-YEAR CLOSURE TIMEFRAME EXTENSION
LINED DECANT WATER POND
Four Corners Power Plant – Fruitland, New Mexico**

Pursuant to 40 Code of Federal Regulations (CFR) Section (§) 257.102(f)(2)(i) of the Coal Combustion Residuals (CCR) Rule, Arizona Public Service Company (APS) submits this initial 2-year extension demonstration to the facility operating record to extend the timeframe to complete closure of the Lined Decant Water Pond (LDWP) from April 10, 2026 to April 10, 2028. In accordance with § 257.102(d), § 257.102(f)(1)(ii), and § 257.102(f)(2)(i), CCR surface impoundments closed when leaving CCR in place must meet the requirements of a general performance standard, drain and stabilize the unit, and install a final cover system within 5 years of commencing closure activities unless it is demonstrated that additional time is required due to factors beyond the facility's control. The CCR Rule at § 257.102(f)(2)(ii)(B), anticipates that time extensions may be required and sets a maximum time extension for CCR surface impoundments larger than 40 acres to 10 years via five 2-year extensions.

Initiation of closure for the LDWP occurred on April 10, 2021, concurrent with the Lined Ash Impoundment (LAI) which is designed to decant seepage from the LAI into the LDWP. Since that time, APS has been progressing closure at the LAI, advancing closure design/strategy and initiating construction contracting at the LDWP. Given the integrated nature of the LAI/LDWP, closure of the LDWP requires more time to close with the LAI. As such, APS is exercising this initial two-year extension to continue closure activities at the unit.
